Agawam draws third seed for tournament

HOLYOKE – With strength of schedule continuing to dictate the fate of certain teams that play against schools with Division 2 and 3 populations, teams like the Holyoke High School boys volleyball team will continue starting the tournament on the road despite having a better overall record than about a quarter of the field.

Seeds for this year's boys volleyball tournament were released on Tuesday morning in a meeting held at Agawam High School, the chair school for the sport.

Holyoke, with an 11-7 overall record, qualified for the tournament with the last seed, No. 12.

As a result, the Knights were scheduled to face No. 5 West Springfield in the first round of the tournament, which was held Thursday, May 25.

Should Holyoke be victorious, the Knights would move on and face No. 4 Minnechaug Regional, which ended the regular season strong and with a 12-6 overall record.

The top three teams in the tournament were no surprise, as Westfield, Chicopee Comprehensive, and Agawam High School received the top three seeds. Agawam had an opportunity to finish higher, but the Brownies had some struggles near the end of the regular season, dropping key matchups against Minnechaug, Westfield, and Ludlow in the second half of the season.

Agawam did rebound with a win over Chicopee Comprehensive to finish the regular season, but it was not enough to overtake the Colts in the Walker system of rating teams with overall record, wins against tournament-qualifying teams, and strength of schedule.

Comp had a tough start to the season with a little bit of a younger squad, but the Colts would rebound and finished 14-4.

Westfield, the reigning Western Massachusetts Champions, finished 14-3. Central, which came out of nowhere to be the runner up in last year's tournament, fell back to earth, but finished with an 11-9 record to qualify for tournament.

Ludlow High School, which finished at 11-7, showed signs of strength at times, and

picked up some upset wins over the course of the year, is the No. 6 seed. Ludlow hosted No. 11 Athol on May 25.

If the Lions are victorious, they are currently scheduled to travel to No. 3 Agawam on Tuesday, May 30 at 6:30 p.m.

The only quarterfinal game subject to change is for No. 2 Chicopee Comprehensive. If No. 7 Sabis wins its preliminary round game, the quarterfinal could be played on Monday, May 29 or Wednesday, May 31 due to a scheduling conflict for Sabis.

The semifinals for the tournament are set for Thursday, June 1, with the finals set for Monday, June 5 at 6:30 p.m. at Holyoke Community College.

At the seedings meetings, coaches discussed strength of schedule issues, and tournament officials said discussions have been had about having more than one division as the sport continues to expand, though no changes are imminent. Boys volleyball has a little less than 100 teams in the state, while girls volleyball has almost three times that.
