15 percent in the past 10 years.

Letellier said each new additional firefighter position would cost the town \$56,000, a low enough number that Cohen should have been able to at least partially fund Sirois' request.

"I'm disappointed that in the scope of the whole budget, we couldn't find enough to hire at least one person," Letellier said.

Sirois said because of the Fire Department's "platoon" system, hiring just one firefighter would not make much of a difference. To affect staffing across all shifts, the town should fund new positions in multiples of four, Sirois said.

In all, the fiscal 2018 general fund budget proposed by the mayor shows a 2.63 percent increase from the current budget, from \$88.45 million to \$90.78 million. The School Department represents more than half of that spending — \$46.00 million — and is slated for a higher rate of growth than the "town side" of the budget. Schools are asking for a 3.45 percent increase from their fiscal 2017 budget.

Monday's hearing was the first of three opportunities for the City Council to weigh in on the budget proposed by the mayor. On Monday, the council looked at budgets for town departments such as Fire, Planning, Public Works and Schools, as well as the town's administration and financial departments. The council will hear budget presentations for Clerk, Emergency Management, Golf Course, Health, Information Technology, Inspection Services, Library, Parks and Recreation, Police, Senior Center, and Veterans departments at a workshop meeting at 7 p.m. Monday, June 12, at Roberta Doering School, 68 Main St., Agawam.

The council will hold a public hearing on the full budget at 7 p.m. Monday, June 19, also in the Doering School. Copies of the budget are available for public inspection at the town clerk's office in Town Hall, 36 Main St., Agawam; in the library at 750 Cooper St., Agawam; and in the Senior Center at 954 Main St., Agawam.
