Red Cross seeks volunteers to teach preparedness skills

CAMBRIDGE – Former educators and new volunteers are needed to assist the Red Cross in teaching area children the important skills they need to successfully adapt to and prepare for emergencies.

The Pillowcase Project, a national program offered in schools, after-school programs, summer camps and other youth programs and events teaches third through fifth graders and their families how to prepare for disasters.

To volunteer, people may visit <http://www.redcross.org/volunteer/become-a-volunteer#step1>. They should enter their zip code and select "Community Disaster Education/ Preparedness" from there interested community mem-

bers will be lead through the volunteer application. They can also call 1-800-564-1234 to volunteer.

The Pillowcase Project curriculum is structured by three core principles: Learn, Practice and Share. Students will learn about hazards, how to prepare for emergencies, enhance coping skills, practice what they have learned and share their knowledge with friends and family. The program emphasizes the importance of practicing protective actions, developing an emergency communications plan and practicing a home fire drill.

The program also teaches students how to create their own emergency supplies kit by packing essential items in a pillowcase for

easy transport during an emergency. Students will have the opportunity to decorate and personalize their pillowcases during the presentation and are encouraged to take them home to create a kit.

Created in New Orleans, The Pillowcase Project was inspired by the story of local university students carrying their belongings in pillowcases during Hurricane Katrina evacuations. Through the program, the Red Cross aims to empower children to prepare themselves, their households, and their communities for emergencies.

Since July 2015, the American Red Cross of Massachusetts has taught the Pillowcase Project curriculum to more than 7,000 students in the Commonwealth.
