home with me.”

In the wake of last Thursday's tragedy, Chicopee schools focused their efforts on providing resources for students and staff dealing with the traumatic aftermath.

“We have a rather extensive protocol in terms of the organizations we [enlist] to get additional help in,” said Rege. “These include Behavioral Health Network, who has worked with us in the past sending in teams of counselors and providing professional development to our staff for handling these situations: what to say, how to appear present to students or staff who may be in distress.

“The first thing that hap-

pens in situations like this is the principal calls their crisis team in. Together they go over what they know, what they're going to need to operate the following day, and then a call would be placed to us at Central Office. We make known that whatever resources they need, we reallocate to them. In the case of last Friday, we sent in eight district counselors as well as River Valley Counseling – an organization we work with – to provide other counseling services for kids in need. So, we had a vast array of services for when students came in the next day.”

By Friday morning, the Chicopee Comp library had become a sort of triage center, where students could be escorted to talk with counselors who were also on

hand Saturday morning for faculty and staff, and who remained in the school through the start of this week. The past few years have proven difficult ones for the high school, which has had to deal with multiple student deaths.

“Chicopee Comp has faced a number of these issues,” said Rege. “Over the last six years we have had a student who was murdered, we had another student who was shot this [past] summer and died, we have had a variety of accidental deaths, and a number of suicides. It's unfortunate that that building has been hit harder, but as a consequence the staff has had a lot of practice on how to handle these types of situations. My heart goes out to that staff, simply because of the number of

times they've had to deal with the deaths of these young students.”

Accompanying that sympathy were words of commendation for a school staff that has proven resilient in the face of tragedy.

“I want to express my total admiration for the staff and administration at Comp who, again, did an outstanding job putting students first,” said Rege. “I know that it is wearing on them emotionally, psychologically, and I can't say how much I admire them and respect the jobs that they've done in the face of just an abhorrent number of student deaths over the past six or seven years.”

District Attorney Anthony Gulluni expressed his sympathy to the families affected by this

tragic incident. Police Chief William Jebb also offered condolences and recognized Capt. Lonny Dakin and Lt. Holly Davis for their professionalism and integrity. He also thanked Gulluni and the Massachusetts State Police Detective Unit under his guidance for their assistance. The incident remains under investigation.
