or pull people out," Ratelle said.

The four incumbent at-large city councilors – Frank N. Laflamme, Gerard (Jerry) Roy, James K. Tillotson and Robert J. Zygarowski – have no ballot opposition this year, along with councilors Shane D. Brooks (Ward 2), John L. Vieau (Ward 3), William C. Courchesne (Ward 7) and Stanley J. Walczak (Ward 9).

In Ward 1, former councilor Dino A. Brunetti and Joel D. McAuliffe, district director for Sen. Eric P. Lesser and a former aide to Mayor Kos, are both looking to permanently fill the seat vacated by Adam D. Lamontagne in June. Lamontagne, who previously served six years as the Ward 1 representative on the School Committee before joining the City Council in 2014, resigned his seat to join the Chicopee Police Department. Brunetti, who occupied the Ward 1 council seat for 10 years, was appointed to fill out the remaining term back in August. The city charter allows the City Council to fill a vacant seat as long as it is more than six months before the term ends on Jan. 1.

In Ward 4, George A. Balakier is the only candidate looking to succeed longtime councilor William Zaskey, who announced his impending retirement from the council back in February. One of the longest-serving City Council members, Zaskey started his political career in Chicopee in 1970 when he was appointed to the Board of Appeals, a position he held for eight years. The last president of the Board of Aldermen, he has represented Ward 4 on the City Council for 28 years.

The ballot will feature contested races in Wards 5, 6 and 8, with incumbents Frederick T. Krampits, Timothy S. McLellan and Gary R. Labrie facing opposition from Atty. Michael T. Kogut, Derek Dobosz, and Donald M. Vadnais, respectively.

School Committee incumbents are running unopposed in all but two Wards (1 and 8). In September, Ward 1 voters narrowed the field of candidates from three to two, with incumbent Dana C. Cutter bested by newcomers Trina M. House-LaBonte and James E. Tanhauser, Jr.

In Ward 8, newcomers W. Kaween Fernando and David M. Schryver, Sr., are vying for the seat being vacated by longtime member Sharon M. Nawrocki, who opted not to seek re-election.

Nawrocki took out nomination papers but did not return them, ending her 12-year tenure as the School Committee's Ward 8 representative.

The two at-large seats on the school board will be filled by incumbent Chester J. Szetela and newcomer Monsita J. Moorehead as incumbent Michael Pise is not running for re-election.

Polls are open on Election Day, Tuesday, Nov. 7, from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.
