He was the first in his family to attend college and received his Engineering and Business Degree from Northeastern University in Springfield and his B.S. in Mechanical Engineering from Western New England College. Victor was a proud United States Army Veteran of World War II and a member of the "Greatest Generation." He was commissioned in the Corps of Engineers, where he served in the 2nd Engineer Amphibian Brigade and was deployed to the Pacific Theatre in Australia, New Guinea, the Philippines and Japan.
