retain an attorney," explained assistant clinical professor of law Robert Statchen. "By using the clinic's services, businesses can avoid problems by getting legal issues addressed early and correctly. It also provides students with a great opportunity to get real world experience."

To participate, small business owners must submit their applications by Jan. 1, 2018. Applications received after that date will be considered if resources are available. Students will begin providing services in mid-January.
