made every agonizing step seem worth it.

Less than two weeks later and just one day before the official start of spring, Tom and I strapped on our crampons to finish what we started in 2016. We would attempt to climb our final two winter peaks – Mount Monroe and Mount Washington. Although the forecast looked fairly promising, we were aware that Mount Washington's weather can be incredibly erratic, so we were prepared to turn back if the mountain told us that we weren't welcome that day.

After a challenging three-hour climb, we reached Mount Monroe and were rewarded for our efforts with light winds and partial views. But that changed on both accounts as we headed north toward Mount Washington. The crown of the northeast was engulfed in a dense, impenetrable cloud cover.

The higher we climbed, the harder it became to see the cairns that were guiding our way. We were hiking through an ocean of white. We still felt confident, so we continued upward over the snow and slush and ice-covered rock.

As we approached the broad summit, my heart began beating faster. We were drawn to the brown wooden summit sign marking the highest point on the mountain as if by some invisible force. I braced myself against the powerful gusts that threatened to knock me off balance, planted my feet on the uneven rocks, and raised my arms in victory. "We DID it!" I yelled over the

sound of the raging wind.

"We sure did," Tom shouted back. We hugged. We kissed. We rejoiced. Then we rushed off of the summit to escape from the unyielding gusts. We would celebrate once we were no longer engulfed in clouds.

The deafening wind made it impossible to carry on a conversation with Tom, so I became lost in my own thoughts as we descended over the ice-covered rocks. I thought about our very first winter-like hike in November 2016, when we had been so certain that we'd never hike all 48 peaks in winter. We hadn't believed that we would be capable of achieving what we perceived as an impossible goal. But we went ahead and attempted it nonetheless. And although it took us six winters to get them all done, we finished the list.

So this is for those of you who think that you're not fit enough, young enough, strong enough, or fast enough.... YOU. ARE. ENOUGH.

To all of you who think that you can't. Who were told that you shouldn't. Who believes that you mustn't – YOU CAN!

You are stronger than you think. More capable than you believe. And have more power than you can imagine.

If Tom and I had listened to that voice in our heads back in 2016, we would never have been standing on the summit of a 6,288-foot mountain in full-on winter conditions, at the ages of 56 and 65. In spite of our fears: in spite of our doubts: we believed that we could. So we did. SO. CAN. YOU.

Beeston sailed wide.

The Pioneers had another chance on a corner kick ten minutes into the second half on a header by Federico Gutierrez, but it deflected off the left post.

Another header by Justin Freitas during the 80th minute was saved by Flower City goalie Maykell Ortega Campos.

Western Mass. goalie Jermaine Fordah also made a couple of outstanding saves at the other end of the field.

Flower City, who's a first-year member of the National Independent Soc-

cer Association (NISA), took a 1-0 lead during the 95th minute when Lukas Fernandes blasted a left-footed shot into the upper left corner just out of Fordah's reach.

Then a Flower City player received a straight red card from the referee, which gave the Pioneers some momentum.

"Our fans really got into the game following the red card," Hicks said. "It definitely helped reenergize us, but it just wasn't our day."

The Pioneers had several corner kicks late in the second 15-minute overtime period, but Flower City managed to hold onto the 1-0 advantage.

The Pioneers will be beginning the USL 2 regular season with a road match against Boston City FC on May 11. Their regular season roster is made up of mostly college soccer players. Because of NCAA rules, those players couldn't participate in the U.S. Open Cup.

Hicks helped Monson High School capture back-to-back Division 4 State championship titles in 2015 and 2016. He scored the game winning goal in overtime on an incredible shot in the 2016 finals.

Hicks, who's known as the Hometown Hero in Monson, wrapped up his collegiate soccer career at A.I.C. in Springfield last fall.

"When I was a freshman at A.I.C., I really didn't think I would get very much playing time," Hicks said. "I wound up playing in every game there."

Hicks played in a total of 72 career games during his college career, which tied the school record. He played in 21 games this past season.

"The past five years have been some of the best years of my life," Hicks said. "I just loved playing college soccer."

The Yellow Jackets, who finished with a 15-5-1 overall record last fall, qualified for the NCAA Division 2 tournament. They wound up playing two tournament matches at the Welch Athletic Complex in Charleston, West Virginia.

"It was our best season ever," said Hicks, who was a graduate student. "We wound up finishing second in the Northeast 10 conference. We also made the NCAA tournament for the first time. We worked very hard to get there and it was just an unbelievable experience."

After winning their first ever NCAA Tournament match with a 4-0 shutout win versus Molloy College, the Yellow Jackets outstanding season came to an end following a 4-0 loss to the top-seeded University of Charleston.

Hicks played in several matches for the Pioneers a year ago before suffering an injury. He's looking forward to playing in front of the home crowd this summer at the only soccer specific stadium in New England.
