matched Handzel. He allowed only one run on just two base hits. He got himself into trouble in the sixth inning and was replaced on the mound by righthander DJ LaValley, who played for Peoples Bank last year.

"It was the first game Claudio has pitched for us," Bourgeoise said. "He just ran out of gas in the sixth inning."

The Tigers left at least one runner in scoring position in three of their first four at-bats.

Centerfielder Harley Kagan led off the top of the first inning with a single to center. The ball landed just out of the reach of Peoples Bank centerfielder Tom Bouvier, who tried to make a diving catch. Bourgeoise, who started in left field, hit a double down the right field line.

Handzel settled down as he re-

tired the next two batters on a strikeout and an infield pop-up. Then second baseman L.J. Dennette hit a flyball to left and Ferry made an outstanding diving catch ending the Tigers threat.

Handzel threw 18 pitches in the opening frame, but he finished the game with a total of 83 pitches

With two outs in the top of the second, shortstop Alexis Franco and right fielder Travis Kagan had backto-back singles, but Handzel quickly ended the Tigers rally with a flyball

The Peoples Banks offense put a run on the big scoreboard in leftfield in the bottom half of the frame.

First baseman Kyle Platner (2for-3) hit the first pitch thrown by Santaniello in the bottom of the second up the middle for a base hit. He crossed the plate when designated hitter John Gegestkas, who's one of the Peoples Bank newcomers, blasted a double to deep center field.

Santaniello would retire the next eleven batters that he faced.

Handzel escaped another jam in the fourth inning with the help of a force out at third base and backto-back strikeouts. He finished the game with six K's.

The score remained 1-0 until the bottom of the sixth.

Ferry began the rally for the home team with a leadoff walk, scored on a single to center from shortstop Dave Clark. Bouvier followed with an RBI single to right field, which was the 75th and final pitch thrown by Santaniello. Platner greeted LaValley by hitting a double

Peoples Bank took a 4-0 lead following an infield hit by second baseman Alex Lafayette. Their final two runs came home on another dou-

> ble to left field by catcher Pete Hogan.
