plans for three different properties. One was to make the All Saints Church property on North Street better by creating two separate lots, one for the church and a second for the rectory.

It will improve both lots, Watchilla said. It "certainly makes a bad situation better," said Dimarzio.

Both buildings will have 20 feet behind building to the lot lines, which is part of the downtown commercial area standards, Watchilla said.

Another ANR was for a Pine Street property owned by 40 Pine LLC and occupied by longtime business Gillespie Corporation. It changes the lot lines, and some of the lots there do not really have frontage as they're land locked, according to board members.

Dimarzio said this commercial area, like others in town, was built out before there were zoning bylaws.

The third ANR was for a Campbell Road property that will section off a piece of land that has a single-family home and create a large vacant lot as a second parcel.

Planner update

Watchilla said the town has received \$43,000 Shared Streets grant, which must be spent by December 2023.

The town will be choosing 16 pedestrian blinking crosswalks signals for eight unmarked crosswalks on West Street as well as benches and directional signage for the street. Starodoj suggested Watchilla check if there were funds to educate pedestrians about crossing the streets because

many people just step into a crosswalk no matter how close a car is.

The Planning and Community Development Department has an intern who will be updating the town's open space and recreation plan, which is crucial to getting grants for parks next year, Watchilla said.

The town also received \$30,000 from the Western Mass Economic Development Council to buy a digital events sign for downtown. The Downtown Improvement Committee will choose the best downtown location to have it installed, he said. Terrace, which was also on the list, was accepted by the town as a public way at town meeting in 2005, and will be maintained like all other town ways.

The list will go on to the selectmen for their consideration.

the vacant lot sometime in the future, but there are no plans to do so right now.

Members also decided to continue discussing an ANR for 400 Bacon St., owned by Steven Murphy. He wants to create two lots, one each for the two houses he owns. Having two lots, one for each house, would make the property less non-conforming.

One home dates to about 1871, but the age of the older building hasn't been nailed down, according to land surveyor Joseph Levesque, of Levesque Geomatics, of Sturbridge. The 1871 home was definitely built before the town adopted zoning bylaws and sub-division regulations, he said, but he can't be sure

about the second home.

Planning Board member David Dufresne suggested having Building Inspector BJ Church take a look at the ANR and get her thoughts on the second house. It will be taken up again at the board's Nov. 7 meeting.

Agilitas basins

Planning Board member Richard Eichacker said the town's peer reviewer, an engineer from O'Reilly, Talbot and Okun Engineering Associates, also known as OTO, said the standpipes in two basins on Agilitas Energy's Cutler Ext. solar project can be removed for the winter, but would have to be reinserted in the spring.

The company's design engineer, Nicola Facendola, said if the

standpipes have to be reinserted in the spring, Agilitas Energy will not spend the time and energy to remove them. Facendola said the basins would work better once the standpipes were removed, but the town's engineer was concerned about spring rains.

CoPart peer review

The board approved the hiring of engineering company GZA to provide peer review for the well monitoring plan CoPart will submit for its West Warren junkyard and auto auction business. It will cost \$2,000 of the \$5,000 CoPart has recently provided for the town to use on peer review reports.

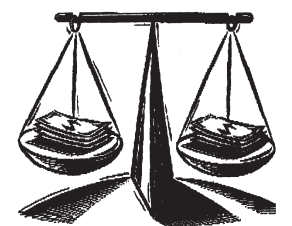

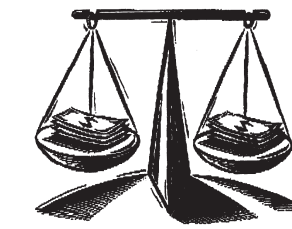
