of work last year. It is an extension of the Morgan-Sullivan Bridge project as town officials looked to do "Complete Streets" work with wider lanes, turn lanes, and bike access throughout the corridor heading toward the bridge. Improvements were made to intersections near the bridge, and O'Brien's corner, which has always been narrow and in need of better turn lanes and traffic signals is being addressed now thanks, in part, to a complete street grant the town acquired.

"The project is already 90% done and will be completed in the spring," Sapelli said. His comments are in line with what Mazza stated last year when work began on the project.

He said the town completed road and sidewalk work throughout the community.

He said more than a mile worth of sidewalk was poured, and near 8,000 feet of road this year.
