

Paula Frances Eddy Leslie, 104

WARE – Paula Eddy was born California. Aug. 14, 1918, in East Weymouth and died March 11,

2023, at the age of 104. When she was in the fourth grade in 1929, her father, Arthur Allen Eddy, took over the Ware Print Company started by her great-grandfather, Charles Wesley Eddy, and the family moved to Ware. Her mother,

Jane Silva Eddy, was a

singer and homemaker. The family built a cottage made of scrap lumber and odds and ends of windows on Lake Wickaboag in West Brookfield.

There Paula's Girl Scout troop pitched tents for overnights, and she and her brother Richard swam, fished, and played with their little sister Mary Jane. Mary Jane died at 16 months, and a year later Paula's parents adopted Herman when he was 3.

Paula graduated from Ware High School in 1936 but had contracted scarlet fever so did not participate in the graduation ceremony. She attended DePauw University in Greencastle, Indiana and earned a bachelor's degree in English composition.

While at college she met Robert Leslie, and they were married at the Methodist Church in Ware in 1941. Paula became a minister's wife when her husband served the Peabody Methodist Church, while attending graduate school at Boston University School of Theology.

Paula and her husband were separated for three and a half years while Bob served as an Army chaplain in New Caledonia during World War II.

Paula heard that the Pentagon was hiring female college graduates from the western Massachusetts women's schools. Because she was a college grad, she applied, and got a job as a "code girl."

She lived in Arlington, Virginia and worked decoding messages for the U.S. government while Bob was away. When Paula turned 100, she was honored for her wartime work with the Army Signal Corps by an exhibit at the Rosie the Riveter Museum in Richmond.

After the war, Paula and Bob settled in Auburndale, where their children were born, William Allen in 1947 and Heather in 1949. In 1954, the family moved to Berkeley, California, and Bob taught psychology and counseling at Pacific School of Religion.

As a faculty wife and active church member, Paula entertained groups in her home and baked cookies and

The family lived in Vienna, Austria in 1960-61 while Bob was on sabbatical leave. Later the couple traveled to countries around the world, staying for academic terms in Philadelphia; Bangalore, India; and Singapore.

muffins for many gatherings.

Paula was always a New Englander at heart and in her accent. She and her husband purchased a family cottage in Scituate and spent summers there in retirement.

Bob sailed, and Paula planned dinners of boiled lobster and fish chowder. She loved to go blueberry picking and entertain her grandchildren: Eric (1975-2001), Sepp (1981-), and Leslie (1985-).

Bob and Paula moved from Berkeley to Napa, California in 1996. Bob died on their 65th wedding anniversary, June 14, 2006.

Just before Paula turned 100, she moved to Livermore to assisted living. During the COVID pandemic, Bill and Heather visited her outside her window and brought her flowers and the newspaper.

Paula read "Ware River News" until her eyes could no longer see the fine print. She cherished her family tree, dating back to the Mayflower and before; her Eddy antiques; and the memories of her mother's Indian pudding and blueberry pie.

During high school, he became passionate about hunting partridges and rabbits with his dog, Speaker. He graduated from the University of Massachusetts with a degree in wildlife biology.


After a short stint with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, he became a drafted soldier in Vietnam where he moved in small groups to monitor villages, trails, and campaigns. He was awarded the Bronze Star for valor and the Air Metal for engaging in more than 50 combat support

Upon discharge he married Fran, the love of his life, and worked on J. and Viola Kordek who preceded degrees from Penn State University. him in death.

In 1978 he began his career with the West Virginia Division of Natural Resources. Walt retired in 2014 after 35 years of dedicated service, during which time he served as Assistant Chief and head of the operations center in Elkins, West Virginia.

After retirement, Fran and Walt downsized and moved to Morgantown.

Walt enjoyed birdwatching, hiking, gardening and was an avid reader. He is survived by his wife of 52 years, Fran Slozak Kordek and by two daughters and their spouses, Kara and Matt Ladd of Cookeville, Tennessee and Mavis and CJ Strakal of Bruceton Mills, West Virginia.


