for the golf course would not be repaid.

"I'm going to be the mayor the next two years," said Johnson. "And you have my word that this loan will be re-paid to the capital stabilization fund with interest."

New carts are needed at the course, that since employing new management and better strategies in recent years, the course is now thriving with surpluses in its budget year after year.

The town established a stabilization fund for the course to address future

capital needs and now, \$258,7000 is being requested to purchase new carts, which will most likely be in place for the beginning of next season, in early 2026.

According to the funding proposal made by Johnson, \$158,700 of the funds needed would come from the golf course's stabilization fund, while the remaining \$100,000 will come from the town's Capital Stabilization Fund. However, that funding will be a loan which will be paid back by the Municipal Golf Course's Revolving Fund at 4% interest. Paybacks are scheduled to take

place with payments made in the next two fiscal year budgets.

Johnson said in a memo to the city council the \$100,000 loan allows \$200,000 to remain in the golf course's stabilization fund while also making sure the town benefits from the loan to the golf course. The golf course would also save substantial funds from not having to pay a traditional bond for the carts.

Previously, the golf cart fleet was done as more of a lease situation. Johnson stated commercial

D.P.U. 25-153 October 22, 2025

Petition of the Town of Agawam for approval by the Department of Public Utilities of a municipal aggregation plan pursuant to G.L. c. 164, § 134.

On October 10, 2025, the Town of Agawam (“Town”) filed a request with the Department of Public Utilities (“Department”) for approval of a municipal aggregation plan pursuant to G.L. c. 164, § 134. General Laws c. 164, § 134 authorizes a municipality to procure electric supply on behalf of consumers within its municipal borders through a municipal aggregation program (“Program”). Eligible electricity consumers not already enrolled with a competitive electric supplier would be automatically enrolled in the Program unless they choose to opt out, in which case they would continue to receive basic service provided by their electric distribution company, Eversource Energy. The Department docketed this petition as D.P.U. 25-153.

The Town has retained Colonial Power Group, Inc. to serve as its consultant in this proceeding and to assist in the implementation of the Program.

The Department will conduct a virtual public hearing to receive comments on the Town’s filing. The Department will conduct the hearing using Zoom videoconferencing on **Wednesday, December 10, 2025**, beginning at **2:00 p.m.** Attendees can join by entering the link, <https://us06web.zoom.us/j/84483459121> from a computer, smartphone, or tablet. No prior software download is required. For audio-only access to the hearings, attendees can dial in at 646 931 3860 (not toll free) and then enter the **Meeting ID# 84483459121**. If you anticipate providing comments via Zoom during the public hearing, to the extent possible, please send an email by the close of business (5:00 p.m.) on **Tuesday, December 9, 2025**, to Lauren.Morris@mass.gov with your name, email address, and mailing address.

Alternatively, any person who desires to comment on this matter may submit written comments to the Department no later than the close of business (5:00 p.m.) on **Wednesday, December 10, 2025**. Please note that in the interest of transparency any comments will be posted to our website as received and without redacting personal information, such as addresses, telephone numbers, or email addresses. As such, consider the extent of information you wish to share when submitting comments. The Department strongly encourages public comments to be submitted by email. If, however, a member of the public is unable to send written comments by email, a paper copy may be sent to Peter Ray, Secretary, Department of Public Utilities, One South Station, Boston, Massachusetts 02110.

All written comments or other documents should be submitted to the Department in **PDF format** by e-mail attachment to dpufiling@mass.gov and Lauren.Morris@mass.gov. The text of the e-mail must specify: (1) the docket number of the proceeding (D.P.U. 25-153); (2) the name of the person or company submitting the filing; and (3) a brief descriptive title of the document. All documents submitted in electronic format will be posted on the Department’s website as soon as practicable at <http://www.mass.gov/dpu>. The e-mail must also include the name, title, and telephone number of a person to contact in the event of questions about the filing. Importantly, all large files must be broken down into electronic files that do not exceed 20MB.
