achusetts throughout her entire career, from children and families on the mental health and behavioral health side to young adults and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

"So, I sort of have had a hand in a lot of different arenas and organizations and they all sort of build on each other in terms of helping vulnerable populations," Theroux said.

Theroux expressed appreciation to the staff and clients for their warm welcome.

"It really does speak to the culture here in terms of being very caring and being very supportive of each other. Wanting to look to the future and what's to come for everybody," Theroux said.

Her goals for her first month would be getting to know everyone at the organization, working with the board, establishing herself in her new role, visiting the programs and "really start to formulate a plan with the board on what the first year of my tenure looks like."

Also, getting out into the community.

"What the priorities are from those who we receive funding from, where we want to sort of start crafting our plan for the next year.

We do have some licensing CARF surveyors, which is the accreditation body coming in next month, so we're prepping for that," Theroux said.

Theroux said getting to know, meet and work with "truly, dedicated staff" fulfills her most, along with the dedication of staff putting those who are served first as the central focus.

"Any decision-making that happens is really what is the best interest of those we serve, the organization and to have that as your moral compass or your guiding star is really (important). It's a different approach to how we do things," Theroux said.

She added human services in Western Mass works "super collaboratively together."

"There is a tremendous amount of shared learning that happens. There is also mountains of shared support amongst organizations, which speaks to not only a desire for everyone to have their own agency do well, but everyone else also to do well along with us," Theroux said.

Organizations like Sunshine Village, she added, provide a lot of support from those the organization employs to working with the individuals to find employment in the community.

"The value of work for those individuals and what that means. For families who, by sending their loved one here, it allows fami-

lies—parents—to work and for our individuals to have relationships with peers, for them to learn various skills, be it job-based or vocational-based skills, social skills of how to interact with their friends, with this skill-building about learning to cook, money management, various vocational skills that we do pre-training before they get to an internship or an actual job setting," Theroux said.

Theroux said she and Kos have been friends and colleagues for a while, which is why "it's truly an honor to step into her shoes," expressing excitement at the future to see what new programs, innovations and growth can happen.

Also, the use of technology for programs to not only support clients, but also the staff.

"I'm fortunate to be stepping into an organization and a position where it's financially strong, the staff are well-trained, it has a solid reputation," Theroux said.

Her message was this.

"Certainly grateful to be here in this really renowned institution and organization. I'm looking forward to making more relationships certainly in my prior role and carry this forward into this. There are several things on the horizon for Sunshine Village. Our Golf Tournament is in August and then we'll be celebrating our 60th anniversary in the upcoming year, so that will also have some announcements and celebrations to look forward to," Theroux said.

of Public Works office, and property owners affected by this project will be contacted by the city of Chicopee.

Once that was established, Roose stated that there are only two crosswalks in the project area, and neither meets the current standard, noting that speeding vehicles pose a threat to sensitive groups such as students and pedestrians alike.

"The primary goal is to improve safety for students who walk to school. We also want to add we're looking to improve the pedestrian circulation around the school, and surrounding streets, and surrounding streets, while improving accessibility, roadway crossings, and to slow vehicular traffic," Roose said.

Roose's presentation also showed that the project is looking to reconstruct and rebuild the existing sidewalks, along with implementing 30 new pedes-

trian curb ramps and 30 reconstructed driveways, with some being fitted with improved stormwater management and traffic control in certain areas, among the property.

Roose also shared that the project is looking to perform work over at the existing brook that currently separates Telegraph Ave and Streiber Drive, which will see the MassDOT submit a notice of intent through the Wetlands Protection Act, in coordination with the Chicopee Conservation Commission.

Lastly, Roose revealed that, as previously noted, the project is currently in the design phase, which is set to be completed this Fall, with a final design package being

submitted in Spring 2027, with a project advertisement being developed and shared in the Fall of 2027.

Those in attendance were invited to participate in a survey to share their feedback.

The project is slated to be completed in the Fall of 2028, just in time for students to arrive back at school to open the new year.

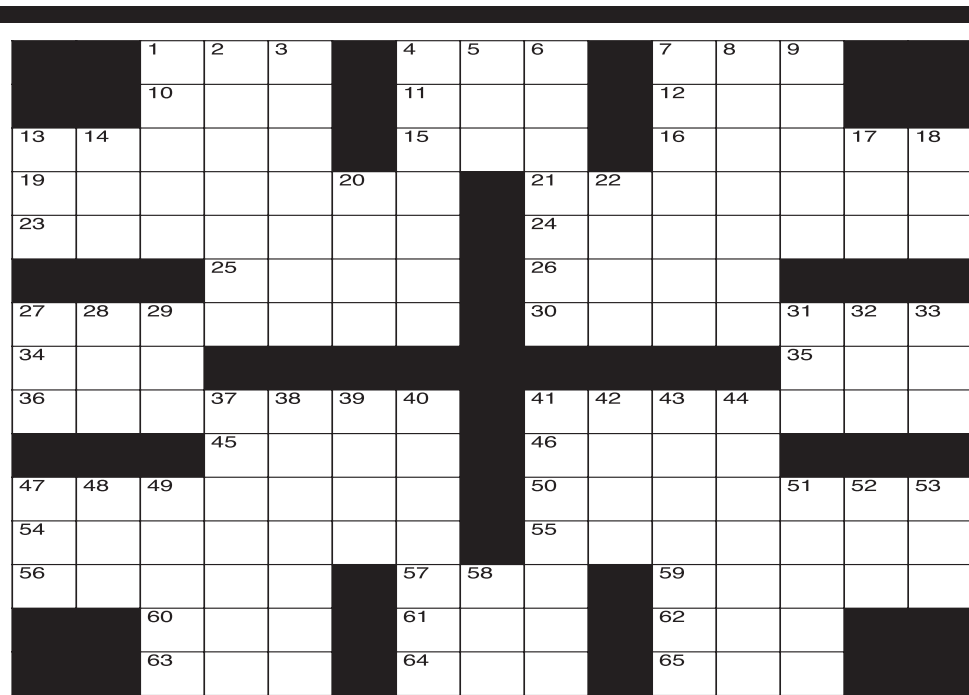

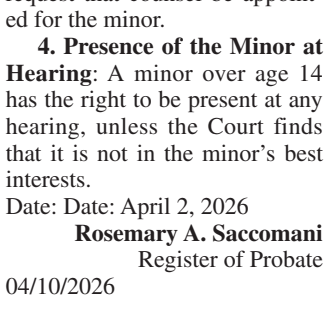
