Bob Cipolli returns to Music in Montgomery in July

MONTGOMERY – Dale Rogers, organizer of the monthly Music in Montgomery series announces the July line up.

Co-hosted by the Montgomery Public Library and Gray Catbird Pottery Studio, Music in Montgomery takes place at Montgomery Town Hall every Thursday, starting at 3 p.m.

July performers include regulars Jerry and Kara Noble, Larry Southard, Ed Bentley and Friends and Ravenwood, with Bob Cipolli returning to the line-up to close the month on July 30.

Opening on Thursday, July 2 are pianist, guitarist and composer Jerry Noble and bassist and Jerry's wife, Kara Noble.

People may have seen Jerry live in Montgomery, at Smith College or at the Bombyx Center for the Arts in Florence.

But you might be interested to hear some of his recorded music available on Apple Music. A search for Jerry will bring up a series he recorded (Journeymen's Songs) with Daniel Zehringer and C. Donald Compton.

Next is Larry Southard on July 9. Southard can be seen all over the hilltowns and this time of year is a frequent performer at the Otis Farmer's Market.

One of his most recent gigs was at the Route 8 Pub, located in the Becket General Store with Lesley Friedman Rosenthal and mandolin player Kurt Hansen.

Holding the middle position for the month is Ed Bentley and Friends on July 16. Like the rest of the Music in Montgomery

folks, Ed gets around and was recently spotted at the Westfield Farmers Market with Tom Boldo and Linda O'Neill.

He covers a range of music and is often seen with Jane Martin Pelletier and Ron Campagna. People never know who will stop in and join him in Montgomery, but settle in for country, rock and folk favorites.

MHS offers program on American Revolution

MONTGOMERY – The Montgomery Historical Society offers the program "Western Massachusetts' role in the American Revolution" to all interested area residents on Saturday, June 27 at 1:30 p.m. in the Montgomery Town Hall at 146 Main St., in the town center.

Presenting the program is Samuel MacMunn, a member of the Westfield Historical Commission, who will appear in period costume and will display items from that period during his talk.

He will enlighten the audience about connections between Western Massachusetts and the War for Independence in 1776, on the occasion of the 250th anniversary of the beginning of the conflict. Montgomery has previously been identified and recognized as the home of Revolutionary War armorer, Richard Falley, Jr.

The program is free and will be followed by an old-fashioned ice cream social.

Donations for the event and the refreshments will be gratefully accepted for the Historical Society's Scholarship Fund, which offers scholarships yearly to graduating high school seniors who live in Montgomery.
