not just say we can establish a budget because nobody knows what the budget is," said Gennette.

Nawracaj commented that Breault said the budget was \$30,000 and Gennette continued, "You have to add the ponds in to increase the budget, and you have to do the survey and all the other stuff. I think you need to take the ponds that you have, and obviously you have gotten started because Haviland

Pond looks great.
I love what the Pond Committee is doing but we really have some ways to go before you actually get established like a budget. You do need funding, I want to fund you, but we need to get through...let's lean on Strange," said Gennette.
Strange explained that he checked with the Accounting Department and found an account to fund the FY26 expenditures requested. "Then it would be up to the board whether to put in a line item to pay for FY27,"

said Strange.
Gennette clarified stating that the board cannot let things go on with the ponds, "But we can't establish a budget yet until we know what the full scope of the budget is. Find ways to fund the fixes now but then we have to build it into a budget. We need a five-year plan so that we can establish all these criteria going forward.
Fixing it now, bringing the other ponds on board, and getting a regular budget," said Gennette.
Vice Chairperson Antho-

ny Alves stated the following, "One thing I do want to say though is I think we need to delineate the reason that the pond hasn't been treated is because we haven't been able to get the permits. We do need the funding to do it, but the timing of why it hasn't been treated yet I think is more driven by the permits rather than the lack of funds.
I don't think it's fair necessarily to say that the Town is kicking it on and on, because there is a committee looking into it. What

I do want to say is that I commend the committee for coming back with this because it's clear you all looked at and listened to our comments," said Alves.
Rosenblum added the point of helping clear the ponds in Town would help property values, "The idea is trying to set you up for FY27 to be on your budget line. This board is on board with it, as Member Manuel Silva says, the money is short for Minechoag. However, the permitting process has been holding us up on

this part of it," said Rosenblum.
Before the conversation could end, Nawracaj pleaded to the board stating, "We need another \$5,765 this week." Rosenblum clarified and said to Nawracaj, "If that \$15,000 is there, do what you need to do with the other ponds because at Minechoag, we're still waiting for clarification.
Once we get clarification and we have a dollar amount, then we can move from there," said Rosenblum.
